

Minutes for March, 2014 General Membership Meeting

President, Rich Allen called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM.

The guests included; Justine Sampson and Karen Mann (Discovery Bay Yacht Club). There are no other guests or prospective members present.

Officers not present – Brian Enbom. Members present – 42

Consensus Items:

Minutes and financial report from February were moved, seconded, and approved.

Board Member Reports:

Secretary (Steve Gilpin) – space for visitor added to attendance sheet. E=mail will be sent to visitor outlining the club and thanking them for visiting. I will be absent for the April meeting. Marilyn will be filling in for me.

Treasurer (Brian Enbom) – absent, Rich presented the financial report and budget.

Vice President and Membership (Mark Zupan) – He and Denise will sponsor a run on April 17 to Sloughhouse.

Events (Neva Burdick) – see report in newsletter of upcoming events.

WSCC Representative (Lee Brant) – Convention is in Medford Oregon and the deadline for sign-up was February 15. Four members have registered for convention.

Quartermaster (Diana Cernera) – brochure is being made outlining available items.

Webmaster (Ralph Cernera) – Described Google calendar which Neva will be responsible for updating on the Website. To receive the new password for entering the members only section Email Ralph.

NCM Representative (Dave Gatt) – the Museum raffled an Alaska cruise and a C7 stingray. The museum is building a racetrack which can be reserved for use, proposing a fall opening the track. The sinkhole is 40' x 60', which contained seven cars.

Old Business

Charity Donations – we will be donating \$250 to each of four groups, Rio Vista Senior Ctr., Shepherd's Gate, Bedford Center, and Kaleidoscope. Rich spoke with Kristen Weldmann (general manager of streets of Brentwood) and she was thrilled that we included them as a cosponsor for the donations.

Car Show – the decision was made to not have a car show this year. But we are holding options to possibly have one next year. This will be reviewed mid-year.

25TH YEAR Club Anniversary – it was decided to piggyback the celebration With the Sloughouse. Committee has been formed to accomplish all needed tasks. Neva requested pictures, games played, ATC.

Caravan to Bowling Green Kentucky for the 20th anniversary of the Corvette Museum - Contact Mark for further information. Some of the members are going as far as Reno, spending the night, and then returning home.

Bylaws – Bylaws are currently being reviewed by the Bylaws Committee, current bylaws have been temporarily removed from the website. When the committee finishes their review and update, a copy of the bylaws will be provided to all members for approval. This will be done by anonymous ballot. Approval will be by simple majority.

Status of WSCC Insurance – the board needs to review the proposed WSCC insurance. Brian and Lee to go over the details on this. Not paying exposes the board to possible liability issues.

Minutes for April, 2014 General Membership Meeting

President, Rich Allen, called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM. Rich thanked everyone for attending and asked if there were any announcements. Kathy Doty announced that Byron Delta Lion's Club was holding an event on the May 31st. It is a tribute to Dick Clark and American Bandstand. Tickets are \$35.00 per person. Denise announced that there would be an Easter Egg Hunt where she works at Westmont on April 19th. Rich announced that Roger and Mary Hodel are on their way back from picking up their new 2014 Corvette from Bowling Green Kentucky. Rich thanked everyone who went on the President's Mystery Run. He received a lot of compliments on how great the run was and everyone especially liked the restaurant. Rich asked Terry Berardy to tell the members how he got interested in Corvettes. He stated that he has been around Corvettes, specifically his, all his life. His present car—a '64 convertible has been in his family for as long as he can remember. His father owned it and instilled a love of Corvettes. He has fond memories of his father taking him for rides in it. When his father died he left it to Terry. This same car will be passed on to Terry's son Wyatt.

Vice President, Mark Zupan, stated that because there were no new or prospective members at the meeting and no badges to pass out he had nothing to report.

Events, Neva Burdick, reported that the next run was the Russian River Run put on by Steve Gilpin on April 13. Please call Steve if you plan on going. There is no pre-payment on this as you will be ordering off the menu. May 18th is the next run put on by Mark and Denise Zupan to Sloughhouse Inn. Deadline for this run is May 11th. Flyer's are on the Website and you have six choices of food to pick from. All meals include tax and tip. May 17th is the all GM Car Show at Abel Chevrolet from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. All members are expected to be there to support this event because it is put on by our sponsor Abel Chevrolet. You can go onto their website and pre-register for this event. Neva went on to discuss our upcoming 25th Anniversary Party on May 31st from 12:30 pm to 5:30 pm held in the Bilge Room at the Yacht Club. Trudi will be making the cake. Tri-tip and chicken will be Bar B Q'ed by our own Bob Anderson. There will be sign-ups for side dishes for the members to bring at our next meeting. Neva asked for a budget approval of \$1,200 for this event as there are expenses such as the rental of the room for \$200, a cleaning deposit needed, Officer of Watch and a bartender that need to be paid up front. About \$275 will be refunded after the event if the room is left in good condition. A motion was made by Mark to approve the \$1,200 budget for the 25th Anniversary Party. The motion was seconded by Bernie. All approved and the motion was passed. Neva went on to say that on June 13th, 14th and 15th there would be a Pour Mann's Cruise to Stockton put on by the Yacht Club and the Corvette Club is invited to join them by car. Public Relations, Marilyn Allen, passed out the checks for the charitable organizations to those who would be presenting them to the organizations they nominated to receive a donation this year. Bernie took Bedford Senior Center, Rio Vista Senior Center and Shepherd's Gate and Marilyn took the check for Kaleidoscope. Pictures will be taken at each presentation, put in the Newsletter and hopefully in local newspapers.

April Minutes

WSCC Representative, Lee Brant stated that we have great representation for Convention this year. Approximately 12 memberships have signed up to attend. Late registration is still available but there is no room available at the Convention site. Rooms are still available at an alternate hotel that is about 5 miles away. April 27th is the first Auto Cross. This is a beginner's class and will take place at the Solano College in Fairfield. Lee will lead the group to the Auto Cross event from Chase Bank parking lot. Webmaster, Ralph Cernera, stated that all was going well on the website. There were a few times the site was shut down for updates. Joanne stated that Ralph was doing a great job. All members agreed.

Member at Large, Nelson Friesen, stated that he is working on the Inaugural for 2015.

NCM Representative, Dave Gatt, reported that there is only one car left to retrieve from the sink hole at the museum. He also stated that members could get insurance through NCM and suggested if members were paying a high insurance to check into the NCM insurance as the coverage is very good and much less expensive for a car that one uses occasionally. He also stated that if you went to any of the driving schools offered by the NCM that you would receive a discount on your insurance. AARP also offers driving classes for a fee of between \$15 and \$20 which can also decrease your insurance. Dave also stated that he would like to suggest a possibility of donating money to the NCM to help finance the retrieval and restoration of the museum cars. Rich stated that this will be brought up and discussed at the next Board meeting.


Rich Allen asked for approval of the Treasurer's report for March. A motion was made and seconded to approve the March Treasurer's report. Motion passed.







I am honored to be part of the Discovery Bay Corvette Club's Board and so happy to be getting to know all the members better. I can see how amazing all of you are and how many


