Seeing our incredible country in Corvette, what an experience!

This was Diana's and my first time participating in the NCM Corvette Caravan to Bowling Green Kentucky. Being the 25th Anniversary of the NCM made it even better. And one step above that was also being able to do this trip with our son Wes and his girlfriend Liz, also first-timers.

We started our journey in our driveway the morning of August 22nd, trying to figure out how we were going fit 'all that crap' into our Vettes for a two plus week trip. As Mark Zupan mentioned on one of the many mornings repacking at a hotel, "caravan is not for wimps!" Somehow we got it all in, and would rearrange the 'clothes puzzle' many more times over the next coming days.

There were nine Corvettes from DBCC (a new record I believe), leaving that morning from Able Chevrolet, along with about 90 other cars in our "Pacific Central" group.





We headed northeast towards Carson City where we welcomed a pit stop and box lunch at Hohl Chevrolet, and then off we went again. Our first overnight stop was in Fallon Nevada, where we enjoyed a stop at the Fallon Air Force base, home of the real "Top Gun" naval weapons school training center. We had a great dinner in the officers club, and were able to hang with the 'students' in the bar before heading to our hotels.





As we drove east, different members carved multiple paths to the finish line, but we all spent time in various sized 'Corvette caravan clusters' as we worked our way across the country. The next days took us 14

personally across highway 50 (aptly named the Loneliness Highway in America) through Richfield Utah, Silverthorne Colorado, Colby Kansas, and Kansas City Missouri.

The crown jewel stop (other than Bowling Green of course), had to be Cape Girardeau, Missouri. These folks definitely know how to host a Corvette Caravan and throw a party! The entire downtown area was cordoned off and filled with Corvettes. My guess was 400-500 of them. There were street vendors, food trucks, live music, and a free shuttle to the casino. It was incredibly organized and the best 'car show' I have ever been to. The next morning they organized a group exodus from the town shopping center with a full police escort leading us out of town and onto the freeway. I would love to see the aerial footage of that if there was any.





We left Cape Girardeau into the home stretch, and after seven days and 6 nights of driving, eating, drinking, unpacking/repacking, yelling at the navigator, etc., we finally arrived in Bowling Green, to be greeted by some 8,000 other Corvettes and their owners. Quite the sight!





We stayed in Nashville for four days, visited the NCM and ran the track day, then worked our way back home on US40, which is paralleled by the old Route 66, and home to many other great sights, like the "Painted Cadillac's standing in the dirt:





The Corvette is an incredible vehicle, as we all already know, and it performed flawlessly on the trip. By the time we returned home, we had logged a total of about 5,000 miles, and most of those where near or above the 80 MPH mark. The AC never stopped running, and even with that I averaged 26 miles per gallon in our C6 with over 100,000 miles on it.

As we all know, there is something very passionate about the Corvette owner. We clearly love our cars, but being part of the Corvette 'family' makes it even better. Since joining the DBCC, we have made so many new friends, and it was that much more special to be able to make part of this journey with them.
