



WSCC announced the passing of former WSCC President Rob Weaver. Rob was not only the president of WSCC for 15 years he was also a member of many clubs, including South Valley Corvettes. Rob and his late wife, Gloria, enjoyed car shows, auto cross and rallye events during their time in WSCC. They also attended several of the club meetings and were key in planning and promoting WSCC Conventions. Rob was constantly promoting WSCC and all the clubs, making sure everyone was always having a good time. Rob's smile was his trademark and when he smiled you couldn't help but smile back. He left his mark on WSCC and will be greatly missed. Our hearts go out to his daughter Lila, grandson Marcus and all of Rob's family during this difficult time.





Robert Lewis Weaver of Morgan Hill, CA passed away on February 5th, 2024 at the age of 80. He was born on May 15, 1943 in Hagerstown, MD. He retired in 1998 after 38 years of dedicated employment to Lockheed Missile & Space located in Sunnyvale, CA as a Group Engineer and Facilities Manager for the FBM Program.

Robert will be most remembered for his love of cars. He spent 16 years as the President of the Western States Corvette Counsel. He won numerous awards for car shows and race competitions. He also participated in corvette rallies locally and across the United States with his late wife Gloria Weaver. He is survived by his daughter Lila Weaver from Campbell, CA, Steve Bautista step-son from Las Vegas, NV and Frank Bautista step-son from Yuba City, CA, as well as 7 grandchildren, 22 great grandchildren and 15 great great grandchildren. He is loved and will be missed by all his family and friends.

DBCC GENERAL MEETING MINUTES/ORDER OF BUSINESS DATE: 3-7-2024

Call to Order: Time: 7:37pm by Shari Peck at the Discovery Bay Yacht Club, Bilge Room. 35 Members present. No Guests present.

President's Report (Shari Peck): *Shari started the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

*Downstairs Honor Bar to remain closed until further notice.

Vice President's Report (Tim Denham) *The Pismo Beach run in June should be a great time. There is one hotel room that is available if someone still wants to join the run. *Tim presented the "Want to Join DBCC" cards for members to take and hand out to interested Corvette owners. *There is a Car show at Sanoma Racetrack and Laguna Seca. *Replacement badges cost \$17 each effective April 1st. Standing Rules to be amended to show this fee. *Tim reminded the members that forgetting to wear your badge to a meeting or Club event will cost you \$1, and BOD members will pay \$2.

Treasurer's Report (Lisa Williams) *Lisa reported the amount of money in the account. (See BOD minutes for amount). * Lisa reported the income at \$147 and expenses at \$49.16 for the last month.

Secretary's Report (Bill Montgomery): *There was a call for approval of the last meeting minutes from the February 1st meeting (see February Newsletter). Motion to approve made by Bob Anderson and seconded by Mary Hodel. Everyone was in favor. No one opposed. Motion approved and carried. Minutes passed as published. * Bill stated that the Standing Rules were approved and sent to Ralph for posting on the website. * The BOD approved the ByLaws changes at the February meeting. Bylaws were sent to the membership for approval on February 29th and voting will end March 31st. *Please sign the sign-in sheet.


