

DBCC GENERAL MEETING MINUTES/ORDER OF BUSINESS DATE: 4-4-2024

Call to Order: Time: 7:34pm by Shari Peck at the Discovery Bay Yacht Club, Bilge Room 32 Members present. 1 Guest present.- Steve Blaz

President's Report (Shari Peck): *Shari started the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. *The Presidents' Mystery Run in still a mystery and will be held either June 8th or 9th. .

Vice President's Report (Tim Denham) *There was a new guest that submitted his application to join at this meeting. His name is Steve Blaz. (Editor note: If I heard this right, Steve said he has a 2021 C8 with Z51 package and it is yellow.). *Replacement badges cost \$17 each now. *There was a reminder that there are post cards that can be handed out to potential members (recruiting cards). *A reminder that there is a \$1 fine for forgetting your badge, and \$2 if you are a BOD member.

***Treasurer's Report (Lisa Williams)** *Lisa reported the amount of money in the account. (See BOD minutes for amount). *Lisa reported the income at \$0 and expenses at \$1,210 for the last month.

Secretary's Report (Bill Montgomery): *There was a call for approval of the last meeting minutes from the March 7th meeting (see March Newsletter). Motion to approve made by Kirk Walker and seconded by Cheryl Fleb'ut. Everyone was in favor. No one opposed. Motion approved and carried. Minutes passed as published.

* Bylaws were sent to the membership for approval on February 29th and voting ended March 31st. The results were 34 Yes, 0 No, out of 91 voting members. The ByLaws are hereby approved by the membership and will be posted to the DBCC Website. The BOD voted to accept the election results and to post the Bylaws in a prior BOD meeting this evening. *Please sign the sign-in sheet.

President's Message



Hello DBCC Members,

Dave and I found a great place for my President's Mystery Run. We have locked in Saturday, June 9th, so please save the date!!

We had a fabulous time on our last run to the California Automobile Museum in Sacramento. The weather was perfect and even though it was my second time visiting, I enjoyed it just as much. A great part of the experience is being able to ride in a vintage car of your choice, driven by the docents. When we arrived, Dave decided he wanted to ride in a vintage Jeep circa 1961. I thought it was a bit strange, because it was pink with a pink and white striped top with tassels, with an appropriately personalized license plate, "BARBIE V". He hasn't even watched the movie! The other funny part in this little jaunt was that Rick Williams, who is well over 6 feet tall insisted on sitting in the back seat. I on the other hand, being 5'2" could have easily sat there with plenty of headroom to spare.

Drake's the Barn had great pizza and once we got the ordering down (I had an issue with their app on my phone,

but it very well could have been operator error). We did have a bit of a problem on the way to the museum, when our leader, Roeland DeSterke had a tire sensor alert that he needed to address. He told everyone to continue without them, and Dave and I let them know we would take the next exit to make sure they were not alone. Since we really have not formally written how a run should be lead, I asked Dave if he would put together some helpful guidelines. Thank you Dave, well stated (as usual)!



RULES OF THE ROAD.

I have been asked to put together some guidelines for our newer members who might want to try and lead a Corvette Club run. Over the years I have led a number of these runs; I know it can be a bit intimidating looking in your rearview and seeing all that gleaming and paint and horsepower following YOU. However, I have learned a few things, some by trial and error (ask Lowell about our romp through Walnut Grove) So here are some points to keep in mind if you lead a run.

GETTING STARTED.

Know your route. If I am going somewhere new, I usually like to try a dry run. Make sure there are no problems or potential hang ups on the way. It gives you a chance to get your Vette out and have confidence you know where you are going. Never trust GPS. Additionally, some leaders print off directions or at least the destination address, this is at the leaders discretion. I like to make sure everyone (copilot is best,) has my cell phone number. Radios only work so well.

Driver's meeting. Before departure, have a meeting with all the drivers. Give them any special directions, make sure everyone has a radio that is tuned to channel 7.0. Discuss any special parking situations or details about arrival. Suggest that the group uses both lanes for left turns if available, it helps keep the group together. Ask for questions.

THE DRIVE.

This is the fun part, SO, have fun. Relax. If the group is large, say more than 15 cars, I like to make sure I have an experienced person who knows the route bring up the rear. They can let you know if everyone has made it through signal lights, if the group has been split up or if there are problems within the group.

As well as a rear guard, for large groups I like to have someone in the middle of the pack to pass along radio information front to back and vice versa.

Radio range isn't good and sometimes it is hard to hear everyone in the group.

While under way, you can inform the group (via radio) of upcoming turns or things up ahead.

SPEED.

This one is important. We all love our Vettes, and from time to time we have all exceeded the legal posted speed limit. But with a large group, especially on the freeway, it can be hard for the cars in the rear to keep up. What with merging, lane changes, and morons who like to merge into the group, it's easy for the rear of the group to have to go very fast to keep up or catch up with the group in the front moving away at 70 MPH. Be aware and keep tabs on the progress of the cars in the rear.

PROBLEMS.

Unfortunately, even as reliable as Corvettes are, the unexpected can come up. Tire problems, warning lights or plain mechanical Gremlins, they do happen.

If someone has a problem, do your best to keep the group together. You might not be able to stop and assist them. You may have passed an exit they need to use.

If this is the case, make SURE that someone is staying with them. One or two cars, this is the ideal situation for the rear car, someone who is experienced and good in a pinch. Try to make phone contact with the driver in trouble. Get a better assessment of the situation, the problem, what they may need and most importantly, who is with them. We NEVER leave anyone behind.

ARRIVAL.

Make sure everyone is accounted for. Check in at the restaurant or venue. Help collect money or distribute tickets. Then, enjoy your day. You've earned it. And, most importantly, as the lead car, look for oncoming Corvettes.... "Save the Wave!!!"

If anyone would like to lead a run, coordinate with Karen Murphy, she can help with logistics and pre trip planning. If anyone needs help with the actual run, I will be more than happy to help or answer any questions. I encourage everyone to try this. You really feel that you are a part of the group and are helping the group do something new. It's a lot of fun.




